Pictometry aerials to aid county tax and EMS depts.

Six years ago, the Macon County Board of Commissioners used 911 funds to pay for the cost of Pictometry Aerials that have been used across county departments such as emergency services, tax assessment, and the sheriff's department. With 911 funds not available to fund the project this year, which is completed every six years, the Macon County Board of Commissioners voted to fund the project, which will cost \$195,232 out of the county's operation budget.

"The software and the new images are important because it allows the county to have four elevations of the improvements instead of one view looking straight down," said Macon

NC DOT could have done a better job

ur staff in the water department have asked me to thank residents for conserving water during the recent drought and fire crisis. Stan Houston is in charge of our water system and monitors levels of the water tanks. He stopped by my office last week to tell me he saw a significant change with higher water levels being maintained during this critical period. High levels in the tanks

would have been essential to fighting a major wildfire in or near the town. So, let me also add my thanks.

I was invited to the Biological Station to hear the research project reports that the UNC students had conducted this past summer and fall. Dr. Jim Costa and Dr. Sarah Workman of the station did a wonderful job in leading this event. I learned from these research presentations about such things as the status of our threatened hemlocks, efforts to bring back the American Chestnut, erosion around steams and rivers and about the habitats of the Golden Wing Warbler and the Green Salamander.

I was impressed by the commitment and focus of these young researchers. Probably a number of Ph. Ds will emerge from

this group. Dr. Costa began the session by stating that scientific inquiry requires the researcher to see things with new eyes. Dr. Workman closed the session expressing the hope that the students would always see and encounter our forest with a new vision of discovery. It was an uplifting afternoon for all.

On Friday I was out of town, but I began receiving calls about roads being cut and trimmed. Af-

ter learning of the roads being trimmed, like Bowery, I realized NCDOT was trimming their state roads.

During the weekend calls continued. On Monday I took a long tour with Lamar Nix, our public works director, to assess the reported damage. We both saw where the crews had done substantial cutting and left the debris on the roadsides. They had used a horizontal bush hog device mounted on a tractor. In many cases large rhododendron branches were splintered. In other instances conduit and cables on telephone poles had been severed, and signs and markers damaged. My assessment is that the DOT contractor could have been much more careful.

On state owned roads, DOT does not consult with local officials about what they do. There is a maintenance schedule that crews and contractors follow, so I, nor our town road department, were informed. DOT has been trimming right of ways throughout the county in the last several days.

Many people do not like the way the trimming was done, but it is a technique the state uses throughout this part of North Carolina where they maintain thousands of road miles. Crews come through this area every few years to cutback overgrowth. There are safety and maintenance issues that drive DOT to trim the way they do. One observation I have is that much of the trimmed foliage will make a strong comeback this spring.

In the meantime, I have talked with area DOT officials concerning how their contractors mow roadways and citizen concerns. One critical issue is for mowers to avoid cutting

NC D.O.T. leaves devastation in its wake. Why?

Dear Editor.

Over the years, I have lived through several hurricanes on the Mississippi Gulf Coast and in the city of New Orleans and have witnessed the aftermath. I know what brutal damage to the landscape looks like up close and personal. If anyone reading this letter has never seen this kind of damage, now is your big chance. Just drive out of town going east on Main Street, which turns into Horse Cove Road, and feast your eyes along both sides of the road. Check out the large and one magnificent bank of rhododendron along the Sargent property; go on along by the Nature Center (I think they're pretty upset), wind up past the Lower Lake Road, swing around the next couple of curves (the debris on the roadbed should be cleared up by the time you read this) and hang a left onto the Bowery Road. Just put your car, or your feet, into slow gear and cruise the length of the road all the way to the end, the bitter end. Let your eyes and your senses drink in the butchered landscape, the splintered bushes, shrubs, the severed tree limbs, the broken branches, the devastation. The ugliness. The total unnecessity of it.

This was not a hurricane sent to us by an impartial Mother Nature, nor by the Town

We lived in New York City until I was 13, and we celebrated Christmas with my father's family in Queens unless we drove south to see my mom's family in Georgia and Alabama.

My Greek aunt was married to an Italian, so very often the meal was prepared by my Uncle Graz's sisters, and we would have homemade pasta among other delights. Dessert was often a good ol' New York cheesecake. I recall dinners with the NYC crowd as being much more boisterous than those with my mother's more sedate Southern relatives.

When we traveled south, we enjoyed turkey, dressing, ham, and the usual array of sweet potato casseroles, butter beans, and peas along with congealed salads. Dessert always included several seven-layer cakes—German chocolate, coconut, lemon cheese—and pound cake and pecan pie.

Daddy never cooked Greek food other than occasionally his mother's Greek meatballs as an appetizer, but we always had a Greek salad. This year, I'm planning pastitsio and Greek salad. I'll pick up feta cheese and Kalamata olives at the grocery store, and visit the local Greek bakery for olive bread, spanakopita, and Greek pastries. My youngest sister, who's always in charge of the pound cake and pecan pie for dessert, is happy to forgo that assignment this year.

Times were I'd have plenty of home-baked cookies on hand, but I just don't do that much baking these days. I do love *kourabiedes*, what I call the Greek wedding cookies, but if I bake them, I'll eat them nonstop, so the only ones in the house will be those that come on the pastry tray from the Greek bakery.

I'm the same way about the sugared peanuts I make annually to give to friends. I try to make just the right amount to

fill the gift tins, with not too many left for us. It's a terrible thing to have next to zero willpower. For me, willpower is keeping the temptation out of the house.

My sister and brother-in-law from New Orleans will arrive Christmas Day with their dog and spend Christmas night, so I'll have cheese, hummus, crackers, and other nibbles on hand to keep us going through the afternoon until the evening festivities begin.


Wymer Eugene Bryson



lands took advantage of this site but voters from North Franklin, South Franklin, East Franklin, Union, Millshoal, Ellijay, Sugarfork, Flats, Smithbridge, Cartoogechaye, Burningtown and Cowee precincts. It has been beneficial for all precincts on Election Day by making shorter waits and quicker voting time."

In the 2012 Presidential Election, the Highlands precinct had 1,056 voters on Election Day and now with the one-stop site, on the 2016 election day there were just 454 voters which made the day much better for voters who experienced shorter lines and quicker voting times; and it was better for the poll workers as well.

Commissioner Paul Higdon requested George to give the board a briefing on the 2016 election, which according to George brought out more voters than ever in Macon County. A total of 1,193 voters utilized the Highlands One-Stop site in 2016, and 9,989 voted at the Franklin one stop location.

George reported that the only problem in the November election came at the Highlands location when a machine wasn't working properly. "The voting machine had a small malfunction in which it would not accept a ballot, but the situation was resolved quickly by providing a different machine," said George.

Commissioner Jim Tate, who was one of the first people to use the malfunctioning machine in Highlands commended George and the Board of Elections for quickly resolving the issue and for keeping things flowing in the process.

In total, Macon County saw 17,883 voters for the November election, which represents 69.44 percent of the county's registered 25,903 voters. George also told the board that leading up to the November election, Macon County registered 2,471 new voters which brought the total number of registered voters in the county to an all-time high of 25,903.

Seventy-five poll workers worked election day, and 13 worked early voting. During early voting, which was open for a total of 180 hours, some days had 100 voters an hour.

Last week, the North Carolina General Assembly met during a special called session and approved a \$201 million relief package that provided assistance for both Hurricane Matthew victims and victims of the Fall wildfires in Western North Carolina.

Both the Senate and House unanimously approved the final aid proposal, which emphasizes rental housing for families displaced by Hurricane Matthew and long-range planning for heavily damaged towns and neighborhoods. There's also money to pay for firefighting when tens of thousands of acres burned in the mountains this fall.

The relief package contains \$25.5 million to address the wildfire response and timber restoration. In addition to potentially rebuilding the Whitewater staircase, the state monies could also provide needed funds to rebuild the Wayah Bald Lookout Tower located in Macon County. The timber roof of the tower was engulfed in flames and needs restoring.

In addition to state dollars being allocated for fire efforts, Macon County

Board of Commissioners approved a midyear budget amendment for the local branch of the North Carolina Forest Service last week.

Tim Howell, newly appointed District Forester for District 9 of the North Carolina Forest Service requested funds from the Macon County Board of Commissioners to cover the cost of repairs needed on the Forest Service office located on Sloan Road in Franklin.

The Forest Service budget is a 60/40 match with the county, meaning the forest service funds projects at 60 percent, while the county matches that with 40 percent. Howell told the commission that because of the historic fire season, the local district's budget was insufficient and additional dollars were needed.

The fire season, paired with repairs being required to the Sloan Road office, left the forest service needing a \$12,000 budget amendment. To meet the 40 percent requirement, Macon County commissioners unanimously approved an additional \$4,800 out of the county's contingency budget to fund the repairs and support the office's budget.

Por many, this "season" represents loss, loneliness and disappointments; for those in the service industry, overworked or in the military, separation.



like Dry Falls, Whiteside Mountain, Sunset Rock, Lake Glenville, The Chattooga River, The Cullasaja River and Gorge the list goes on and on. This portion also includes many fabulous Golf Course Communities which have kept up with the demands to add Croquet and Pickleball courts to their repertoire of amenities.

People and Community:

As a rule, we are a friendly bunch. It's not uncommon to enter into long conversations with visitors at local restaurants, grocery stores, etc. That openness and acceptance goes a long way with visitors and in helping them determine that this is a place they could see themselves living either seasonally or full-time. The generosity of our community to the less fortunate as well as in the support of our growth is phenomenal.

Why is our Market Still Depressed?

All of the above positives and many more factor into the success of our area and thus the success of our real estate market. Unfortunately, while we're selling more property at higher prices, we still have an approximately two-year inventory of homes.

Our area was hit so hard in the downturn starting in 2008 that it's a long way from a full recovery. If you take into account the number of residential homes that were on the market in the beginning of 2016 and the number of homes that were sold so far in 2016 we still did not gain any ground on our inventory.

In fact, as of December 15, 2016 we had added more new listings than were sold for the vear. But it seems we are learning, the Sellers who listed for the first time in 2016 reaped a much higher percentage of closed price to list price than those that were listed in previous vears. That tells us that Sellers are paying attention to Buyers who are looking for a quality product in a good location with a reasonable price. Obviously, every property differs on how these issues relate to the property's market value. That's the point where the Seller and the Realtor need to recognize our market situation and then discuss each point in detail based on other similar properties that have sold as well as the market in general.

The end goal is to sell the home, this means that the home needs to fit what a Buyer is willing to pay for it, i.e. it's market value.

What Do we Do About It?

As a whole, Sellers need to recognize that if the condition, location or reasonable price does not meet what Buyers are looking for then they need to adjust the factor that is available for them to adjust. That could mean updating kitchens or baths, a new paint job, or even something as simple as removing old appliances or furniture to adjust the updated property factor. Location is something you either have or not, the current market has made it clear that properties close to the amenities listed above are the most desirable. The two segments of our market that have remained the strongest throughout this downturn have been homes in or very close to in-town Highlands, preferably walking distance and the homes on Lake Glenville, preferably on the eastern side, nearest Cashiers. The other strong performers, which should be no surprise, are homes with views and newer construction.

What remains is the item that is both the easiest and the hardest to adjust, price. It is a difficult fact to convey that property that was previously considered a beloved family treasure is not as valuable in today's market if it has not been updated. It is also difficult to face a reality that homes purchased at the top of the real estate surge are worth less 10 years later on. These are all difficult but necessary facts to face when looking at the sale of real estate on the Highlands Cashiers Plateau. There are a few other telling numbers in 2016. The average days on the market for homes that sold was 430. The good news for the new listings in 2016 is that they netted an average of 91% of list price to sold price. The homes that sold in 2016 that were listed in 2014 were averaging 79% of the initial list price to sold price and looking at homes initially listed in 2011 the relationship to the closed price is 64%.

The purpose of this article is to try to be positive about our area and the advances we are making to become more and more of a destination to both visit and to live in full time. The fact that we are very much a Buyer's market should contribute to continuing our real estate growth. But for that to happen it will be necessary for existing Sellers to understand the market and the current needs of the Buyer so that we can reduce our residential home inventory. Not until we reach a level of less than 6 months of inventory will we be considered back to a Sellers's market. There's a lot of work to be done to keep our area dynamic and to sell off our inventory, but this remarkable area is worth the effort.

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

"For those of us interested in maintaining a lifestyle that revolves around health and fitness, it's a wonderful opportunity to set some new goals, have fun, and meet other like-minded folks," said Highlands Roadrunners Club President Richard Betz. "We welcome everybody in the community to join us, whether they are runners or not."

The Resolution Run has no entry fee and offers no T-shirts or trophies. Those interested in participating simply gather at Founders Park on the corner of Pine and Fifth Street on Saturday morning. December 31. at 9:00 a.m. and run a three-mile loop at a relaxed pace around the downtown area of Highlands, returning to the Park. Walking breaks for new runners are encouraged. Or participants can walk the entire distance. The run/walk is held "come rain or shine or ice or snow," but Betz maintains that the weather has been perfect for several years, though a little on the chilly side on some occasions.

critical communication lines, and if accidentally done to report it immediately. Second, cleaning up the debris generated by the cutting needs to be done as soon as possible. Third, I am requesting that DOT notify the town when they will be mowing in the city limits.

The head of roadside maintenance and environmental for this district has expressed to me his apologies for any problems caused by the recent mowing activity. He will also be coming to Highlands to meet with me in the next few months to discuss how we can work together on possible appearance enhancements to the roadways in Highlands.

While this trimming could have done better, there are other road maintenance issues that I want to work out with DOT. There are ditches, culverts and storm drains that need to be cleared on a regular basis, not to mention paving, resurfacing and snow plowing of roads.

Town crews will also be trimming overgrowth on town roads in the coming weeks. Trimming has to be done periodically so service and emergency vehicles can access residences. The town does it somewhat differently than the state. While we use the same kind of tractor system, crews immediately remove fallen branches. Other crew members use chainsaws and clippers to trim large, splintered branches. With 38 miles of town roads, we can be more precise in our efforts.

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

County Tax Assessor Richard Lightner. "This newer method allows for a three-dimensional image that is scalable and has vivid details. The tax office can double check the characteristics of the improvements and also measure the same improvements as compared to our tax records. The emergency services uses the same product for better response to developing situations that will involve assistance at any given property."

The software uses flights to take various angles of properties in the county. Rather than one image, that looks over the property, limiting what can be seen in an image, Pictometry Aerials takes five photos of the same property, from different angles to give those using the images a more realistic idea of what they are seeing.

While emergency agencies are the largest users of Pictometry oblique imagery, tax offices are using the software more commonly as an assessment tool to help in reviewing improved properties during revaluation and audits.

Lightner told the board that the North Carolina Department of Revenue's Local Government Division is changing requirements for counties and establishing stricter guidelines during the reassessment process. With the additional mandates, Macon County would need to hire more appraisers and clerical personnel or improve the county's software capabilities. Lightner noted that without the flights and the aerial images, the county would need to hire two additional appraisers to meet the new standards.

"The cost associated with these new positions including benefits and salary would be \$110,000 per year [\$330,000 for three years], not including training and long-term legacy cost," said Lightner. "That compares to the Pictometry cost of roughly \$97,571 per year for two years. In addition, this addition of new appraisers would deliver no additional benefit to the other county departments nor would any other services be enhanced."

The new software allows for a threedimensional image the is scalable and has vivid details. In addition to the tax office using the software, Emergency Management Director Warren Cabe said that his department uses the images daily and having the capability of oblique imagery will greatly benefit his department as well.

The cost of the project will cover two flights over the next six years. The first flights will be in January, with no leaves on the trees and no snow on the ground. The first flight will cost the county \$97,571, with the second flight costing \$97,661.


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


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
