Hotwire Communications to run town's broadband highway

The big news out of last week's November Town Board meeting was two things: the decision to go with Hotwire as the

closed system provider on the town's broadband highway known as Highlands Smart Cities Network and the passing of an amendment

to the Highlands Code of Ordinances requiring locked lids on bear-resistant toters, or risk a pen-

AHEC to round out tech needs at **Highlands School**

Despite a year that has been far from normal, the Advance Highlands Education Committee (AHEC) has continued on its course to raise funds for immediate technology needs at Highlands School.

With help from grants from Mountain Findings, Highlands Cashiers Health Foundation and Highlands Community Fund -- an affiliate of The Community Foundation of Western North Carolina, AHEC recently placed its final order for remaining laptops for high schoolers, iPad keyboards for grades 4-8, and a set of Google Expedition virtual reality goggles to be used across all grades.

"AHEC has done just an incredible job of reaching out to the community and getting people to help Highlands School provide the electronic components that our students need to be ready for life and work in this online world," said Principal Brian Jetter. "Without AHEC's leadership our students would not have the same

wearing masks. I hope for the day soon where I can see people's facial expressions, especially their smiles.







alty.

Mayor Pat Taylor said not securing lids and letting garbage overflow defeats the purpose of a bear-resistant toter.

The broadband highway issue was discussed in closed session with the outcome released the next day.

In closed session the Highlands Board of Commissioners heard reports from Town Attorney JK Coward, Finance Director Rebecca Shuler and IT Director Matt Shuler concerning the financial status of two companies that submitted bids to lease the dark fiber of the Highlands Smart Cities Network.

Initially three companies submitted a Request for Proposal (RFP) – North Carolina Broadband, Balsam West and Hotwire, but prior to the Town Board meeting North Carolina Broadband – the only "open" network contender – withdrew its bid

During the closed session, the board also heard a report from the Town Manager Josh Ward concerning the references of the two companies.

In open session the board voted 4 to 1 to enter into contract negotiations with Hotwire Communications. Commissioner Marc Hehn voted "nay."

Town staff will now develop a draft contract for the leasing of the dark fiber. The draft contract will be reviewed by the board and then sent to Hotwire Communications for their review and acceptance.

In addition, in a 5-0 vote, the board called for a public hearing at the December Town Board meeting to refinance the fiber optic buildout project loan with BB &T at a lower interest rate.

If the town makes more on the loan than the cost of building out the network, it has to be a taxable loan.

Hotwire is offering \$10,200,000 over 25 years – far more than the 15-year \$4.6 million loan with interest.

The nutshell of Hotwire's RFP is to begin connecting customers three months after connection of upstream bandwidth; for residential customers they will offer Internet up to 10 Gps, voice, television, home automation and home security; and will build underground in three years with customer commitment.

"We will be negotiating the expedient build-out of the underground portions of the network," said Mayor Pat Taylor. "About 17%-18% of neighborhoods have underground utilities and the fiber will have to be underground, too, in those areas."

Hotwire's fees for various residential and commercial packages are very competitive. However, customers who want to stay with the town's initial provider – and the only other provider on the "highway" – Altitudes – may do so. Hotwire said it will honor those prices.

Any transition would be done after notification and coordinating with customers so that the change in service minimizes any effect on the customer's broadband use.

"High speed Internet, voice, television, and home automation/security are standard offerings for residential and small and medium business customers that Hotwire will bring to the Highlands. Pricing and services will remain competitive and in sync with the prices and offerings in larger, competitive markets – introducing residents and businesses to prices and services that are typically driven by rich competition."

Time to Subscriber Connections

"Bringing in sufficient, secured connectivity and connecting it to Hotwire's core network will be a top prior-

BREC varsity volleyball team defeats Highlands in season opener

Blue Ridge Early College varsity volleyball team travelled to Highlands on Wednesday Nov. 18 for the official season opener and took the win 3-1.

The Lady Bobcats came out swinging, coming fresh off the heels of scrimmages against Swain and Hiwassee Dam.

It was the Lady Highlanders first time back on the court in a game setting and they were also without hitter Jordan Carrier. Carrier is out for the season because of a torn ACL, MCL, and meniscus in her left knee.

BREC Coach Carlton Fowler said they played well, and every time they step on the court against Highlands it's a challenge.

"I thought we did a great job," said Fowler. "Highlands is a scrappy team and they played great also. It doesn't matter what the situation is, season opener or conference championship, every time we play against them it's going to be tough. This isn't a conference game and we know they're going to come back."

Wednesday's game was not a conference match because of changes in the season's schedule due to COVID. The breakdown is that each team plays against teams in their conference three times. The first game is considered a regular season game, and the second two are conference games.

Highlands Coach Desiray Schmitt said she was happy with what she saw on the court.

"We did really good," said Schmitt. "We were hustling like we're supposed to, blocking, returning their serves, getting our tips in, they were really reading the court well. But covering, it just killed us all game."

BREC Gracie Watson said it's always a challenge taking on Highlands, but it helped to get a couple of scrimmages in before the season officially began.

"We did great," said Watson.
"We communicated better than
we have been in the past, we kept
our emotions out of it, and the

game seemed to start slower without Jordan [Carrier] hitting it at us right from the start."

All athletes wore masks on the court because of COVID-19 protocols. Watson said it was difficult to hear her teammates through the masks, but they had to adjust.

Highlands Brandy Zagal made her first appearance on the Lady Highlanders varsity squad and said it was exciting starting off the season against BREC.

"It was my first game playing on varsity, we played Blue Ridge, and the first game of the season is always the worst," said Zagal. "I was scared. I've heard about the hits from Gracie [Watson] and Charlotte [Sherrill] and they're tough. And our covering was awful, we weren't getting close enough and the ball would just drop right in front of us."

Spectators of athletic events are currently limited to parents, support staff, and media in adherence with North Carolina High School Athletic Association guidelines.

an upgrade from an Airbus EC 135 to an Airbus EC 145. The EC 145 has more interior space giving nurses and paramedics better access to patients. It also carries more fuel increasing MAMA's range, more powerful engines for a higher payload capacity, and more sophisticated instruments.

MAMA provides medical air transport services 24/7, 365 days a year. This is the third helicopter in MAMA's fleet, so a backup is always available when one needs maintenance.

MAMA Air Medical Supervisor John Grindstaff said all aspects of mission safety are improved in the new helicopter.

"The main reason is safety," said Grindstaff. "We have more sophisticated instruments so we can fly in weather we couldn't fly in before. It has more power and can carry more fuel, and we have 100% patient access that we didn't have before because we didn't have the space. Now we can reach more people and give better patient care. It's been on our wish list for a while and I sleep better now that we have it."

Highlands-Cashiers Hospital CEO Tom Neal said providing medical services at a rural hospital can be challenging, one of the biggest being transporting a critical patient.

"When a patient needs advanced services for events like accidents requiring a trauma center or a heart attack requir-



ing emergency treatment, timely treatment is critical," said Neal. "In healthcare, there are several sayings we have such as the 'golden hour' with trauma or 'time is muscle' for heart attacks. These statements are more than an ad line, they are based upon scientific studies demonstrating the benefit of timely care. The addition of the helicopter to MAMA adds another resource that can support our goal to provide the best care possible."

MAMA's standard crew includes a pilot, nurse, and paramedic. MAMA Pilot Bryan Neal said having more power in the new helicopter comes in handy in the mountains.

"It's bigger and heavier than

the old one, but the first thing I noticed is the power," said Bryan. "It's much easier to climb and get over terrain, and all pilots have been in a situation where they're picking up a heavy patient and don't know if they're going to complete the mission without burning off some fuel to lighten the load. I don't have to worry about that anymore."

Bryan added that new helicopter also has an autopilot system that its predecessor does not. Autopilot allows MAMA to carry out missions in bad weather, such as dense fog or hurricane conditions that Bryan said can quickly form in the mountains.

When a patient is on board,







ity upon signing an agreement or Letter of Intent (LOI.) Hotwire has several data centers in relative proximity to Highlands and there is existing fiber in the region that should reduce the time required to establish and test connectivity.

"While it is securing connectivity. Hotwire will be working on its headend facility, marketing and early signups so that service can be provided once connection is established and tested. Hotwire will commit to lighting its first, non-beta/testing customer no more than three months after connectivity is established but would aim to light its first customers following a two-week testing period of the connectivity and the network."

Local Presence

"After signing an agreement, Hotwire will begin the process of setting up a local office and storefront in the Town of the Highlands – staffing the office and operation from the local community." Financial

"Hotwire proposes that it take over all aspects of the of network management, service provision, infrastructure maintenance, support and all associated functions of the Town's current network and infrastructure. Hotwire will be responsible for providing its full suite of residential, commercial and enterprise services over the network including voice, video, Internet, and home security/automation.

"All risk associated with the operation of the network - including, but not limited to headend builds and upgrades, infrastructure maintenance, labor employment and cost, broadband cost, customer premises equipment, and content costs will be borne by Hotwire.

"As consideration for its network lease. Hotwire proposes to pay the Town of Highlands \$425,000 in quarterly payments beginning in 2022 through 2045.

"As with all portions of this RFP. Hotwire looks forward to discussions both before a final agreement is completed and regular discussions between the Town and Hotwire to ensure that the project is successful and sustainable for all parties involved," reads the RFP.

Pricing

"Hotwire seeks to provide competitive services and pricing based on its local and national market evaluations. We are committed to aggressive pricing and will keep the rates for services in the Town of Highlands on par with those offered in more competitive markets.

"Customers are offered bundles, month to month services, and term contracts so they can find a package that allows them to afford and enjoy their services. Hotwire is aggressive with new customer promotions and existing customer upsells. In all markets, Hotwire's prices for broadband services remain below those of the incumbent providers for similarly bandwidth, but without the fiber advantage."

Mayor Taylor said he expects the contract negotiations and subsequent service to citizens to proceed smoothly and to happen as soon as possible.



advantages students in a more cosmopolitan setting have."

Not long after AHEC was formed in 2018, individuals from across the community were eager to help. "The early donors provided the spark," said board member Derek Taylor. "We would like to thank all of the individual donors who have helped so far."

Board President Hilary Wilkes also recognizes the community approach to their fundraising. "As a committee, we have done very little solicitation outside of writing grants. Many of our donors caught wind of our efforts and approached us to contribute," Wilkes says. "We knew virtual learning was inevitable this year and are very appreciative to those who have helped give Highlands School the tools to meet the challenges that come with that."

AHEC will spend \$150,000 in 2020 on these upgrades, with just under \$300,000 total spent in support of Highlands School over the last two years.

There's always a reason to give thanks

his Thanksgiving celebration is like no other. We struggle to have family and friends gather during a surging pandemic. Thanksgiving celebrations will likely be sparsely attended, if attended at all.

Still, we will celebrate Thanksgiving. We will give thanks, even if it means doing so in an abbreviated manner. We will pause on Thanksgiving and give thought for what we have to be thankful. Even for those who suffer grievously due to the effects of the pandemic, they surely remain aware of God's light shining in their lives. Giving thanks at this time is a bold act of spiritual maturity with God against this vile enemy that harms our life and our community. We will not be defeated!

The constant rhythm of scriptures is to give thanks in all circumstances because "God is for us." Scripture reminds us to see our blessings from God and to offer up praise.

Remember how, on the night he was betrayed, Jesus took bread and he gave thanks. Even though Jesus knew death was coming, Jesus gave thanks to God for the blessings in his life.

The Apostle Paul, imprisoned and under a death sentence, tells the church, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God (Phil. 4:6).

In the book of Habakkuk, the prophet thanks God, "Though the fig tree does not blossom, and no fruit is on the vines... yet I will rejoice in the Lord" (3:17).

Perhaps, giving thanks comes after a certain point in life. After a life lived, after numerous ups and downs, various joys and struggles, a certain spiritual maturity arises in us. It's the awareness that no matter your station is in life, there is the awareness of God's blessings filling your life.

At that Thanksgiving in Plymouth in the fall of 1621, every Pilgrim family had lost someone in the previous months. They landed in Plymouth in the harsh winter of December 1620 with precious little to eat. If the Native Americans had not helped them, they would have all perished.

Only half of those who landed on December 1620, were alive to celebrate only a few months later that 1621 Thanksgiving. For what could they give thanks? They gave thanks to God for being there, for being alive. They gave thanks for the Native Americans who helped them. Gratitude welled up in them in spite of bitter losses and

MAMA Nurse Carrie Underwood doesn't think about bad weather, payload capacity, or anything else beyond caring for her patient. She said the increased space is a huge plus in terms of patient access, but it took a little time to get used to the exposed tail rotor.

"It will be easier to get to the patients in all aspects of their care," said Underwood. "There's so much more space in this aircraft. But use caution around that exposed rotor, if you're over 6'1', steer clear."

MAMA Flight Paramedic Nicholas Cook acts as the navigator on the way to the call but takes position in the back once a patient is on board.

"Access to the patient from where I sit in the rear-facing seat was limited in the old one," said Cook. "Now if I need to do an intervention or insert a breathing tube, I have room to do that. And with more fuel we can go farther out into the region and provide access to people we couldn't normally serve."

MAMA has bases at Mission Hospital in Asheville and Angel Medical Center

in Franklin. Grindstaff said it takes about an hour and twenty minutes to drive the 68 miles between the two without traffic, but it's a 25-minute flight. He said when patients are suffering from stroke, STEMI, or trauma; every second counts.

And it's those critical time-sensitive calls that Neal said having access to medical air transport can save a patient's life.

"Anyone who has visited Highlands appreciates the remote location," said Tom. "While the calls for a helicopter transport may not happen every day, it is critical the response is rapid. Having a reliable transport team could not be more important when one of our patients needs care quickly."

He added that HCA has invested \$5 million to support improvements to Highlands Cashiers Hospital's infrastructure, new technology, and support-improved patient care. He said these investments and the purchase of a new helicopter not only reflect a commitment to the hospital and the community, but also reflect the strength of HCA.




