Current STRs in R1 could be allowed

At Monday night's combination Town Board/Planning Board meeting, the draft ordinance regarding housing in Highlands was presented by Attorney Craig Justice of the Van Winkle law firm. Justice presented several "surprise" findings.

Justice's area of expertise is land use and zoning, and he was hired by the town to help clarify and possibly amend its Unified De-

velopment Ordinance as it applies to housing definitions and allowances in Highlands' various zoning districts. He has represented the town in zoning cases in the past

Select Bank is now First Bancorp

What was once Macon County's largest hometown bank — and one of the first of its kind — has gone through yet another acquisition.

First Bancorp recently announced the completion of its acquisition of Select Bancorp, Inc. the parent company of Select Bank & Trust Company.

The merger solidifies First Bank's position as the leading community bank headquartered in North Carolina, with total assets of over \$10 billion and over 120 branches.

Select Bank & Trust purchased three branches of Entegra Bank in April 2020 — Entegra Bank, which was the original Macon Bank — sold to First Citizens Bank around the same time. Before First Citizens Bank could finalize the acquisition of Entegra

Trusses raised into place at new HFR station

Crews began installing trusses last week at the new Highlands Fire & Rescue Station located across the street from the post office

Trusses are webbed structures used to support the weight of a building's roof. In the case of the new HFR station, 18 trusses are being lifted into place.

Each truss is approx. 80-feet long and 13-feet tall and is made up of three pieces. Each piece weighs approx. 500 pounds and are being raised into place by a lull



I am also thankful that this small, village town has maintained and sense of community and public life. We have resumed many of our community celebrations like the 4th of July fireworks, the Main Street Halloween event, and now the forthcoming town lighting and the Christmas Parade. Our churches and nonprofit organizations are also returning to normal meetings and operations. All of these events


and organizations make this community a very attractive place to put down roots and to conduct business.

I am grateful we endured a major project of paving Main Street and our corridors with little disruption or delay. I am also grateful that Highlands has a strong economy and stable town budget. Town property taxes have not increased in eight years. I also see utility rates remaining stable in the coming year. I am thankful that the town completed the fiber project this year, and that Hotwire will begin their operations at the beginning of next year.

I am also thankful that we had a successful municipal election where vigorous discussion and debate was had about the state of the town and how to address future challenges. I am especially gratified that we had over a 50% voter turnout. The average turnout across the nation for municipal elections is 15%. Our voters did an outstanding job in either doing early voting or turning out on Election Day. 



hanksgiving is probably the biggest wrestling match of all the holidays. It seems great on paper: eating comfort food, catching up with family, showing gratitude for the people in your life. But for many Americans, regardless of politics, race, gender or creed, the Thanksgiving table can be an emotional minefield hiding underneath

the linen tablecloth. In truth, the holidays are one of the few times when an assortment of people with different political, religious and personal beliefs gather in intimate settings. Despite our political differences and minor family disagreements, I wish that we could sit at the same table this year and emphasize our love for each other and blessings received instead of focusing on outside issues

Bank, they were required to offload three branches located in Macon and Jackson counties located at 30 Hyatt Road, Franklin; 498 East Main Street, Sylva; and 473 Carolina Way, Highlands.





forklift, a forklift with a mechanical arm.

Construction is being handled by DR Revnolds and project Superintendent Todd Smith said he hopes to have all the trusses in place by Thanksgiving, but added that moving large metal structures isn't something that should be rushed.

"My main concern is safety," said Smith, "Making sure one of these doesn't fall over in a strong gust of wind or something."

Smith said the goal is to have the new building closed up by winter so work on things such as electrical and plumbing can be done indoors. He said roofers are scheduled to begin work in early December.

Smith said over the next couple of weeks after the trusses are installed, crews will focus on the exterior walls and metal


Our employees are unwavering in their commitment to our community, and

and wrote part of the legislation regarding zoning allowances in the state of North Carolina.

Now under a Stay of Proceedings regarding the lawsuit with Save Highlands, the town hopes to avoid going to court over its Short-term Rental (STRs) debacle which began in August when Highlands' attorney Jay Coward declared STRs illegal in the R1 zone. As Coward said Monday night, "Contrary to popular belief, lawyers would prefer not to have to go to court."

The draft ordinance was put together under Justice's guidance with a workgroup made up of Commissioners Amy Patterson and Brian Stiehler, Town Manager Josh Ward and Attorneys Justice and Coward

As required by North Carolina law, the Planning Board must also go over the ordinance and can make recommendations before it is adopted by the Town Board. Monday's meeting was the first workshop on the matter.

The Planning Board will discuss it fur-

ther at the Dec. 27 meeting and likely again in January. As usual, those are public meetings and public comment may be elicited. The Town Board won't be involved until the ordinance is presented for adoption prior to Feb. 1 which is when the "stay" ends. It can accept the Planning Board's recommendations or reject them.

Justice's surprises included North Carolina's long-standing vested interest law, whereby a land use may continue (be grandfathered) after new ordinances regulating the use are adopted.

Therefore, according to Justice, even if the draft ordinance is accepted, anyone who has used their home as an STR in the R1 district or anywhere else in town, may continue to do so exactly as they have been doing. He said the purpose of the amended ordinance will be to look to the future, not the past.

But if adopted, potential homes in R1 developments or homes under construction in the R1 zone will not be allowed to be rented as STRs in the future.

However, if a home in the R1 zone

changes ownership and has been rented as an STR in the past, the use may continue as long as the owners continue to rent it.

Justice said the "use" follows the land, not the owner.

However, if new owners voluntarily lapse renting for 24 months, the use ceases.

Likewise, if current owners of STR homes in the R1 district cease to rent for 24 months, the use is no longer grandfathered.

Short-term rentals will be allowed in some form in the R2, R3 and all the Business districts – but stipulations would apply regarding the length of stay.

Only Tourist Homes, which are allowed in all zones except R1, can rent rooms less than seven days and up to 175 days a year, but only if the owner of the home is residing on the property.

Whole House STRs in any district other than R1, can only be rented for 7 to 29 days for 25 weeks per year as an accessory use. Only two people per bedroom plus two more will be allowed per home. This doesn't apply to the grandfathered homes in the R1 district.

Another change regards long-term rent-

als – over 30 days. Three unrelated people would be allowed rather than the current five unrelated people. Justice said allowing three is standard; allowing five is not.

Finally, in the grandfathered R1 areas as well as everywhere else, owners must apply for a certificate to use their homes as STRs which would require, name, address, name and contact information of the operator or property manager, a site plan showing parking with no more than four vehicles allowed, the number of bedrooms, copy of the MC Revenue Dept. "property information card," proof that the septic system is safe and adequate, a copy of the rental agreement presented to renters and a statement under oath from the owner or operator that provisions are understood and information in the application is correct.

Current ordinances on the books regarding, parking, garbage and noise must be adhered to regarding STRs (as well as every other home in Highlands) and will be policed by the town's code enforcement officer(s). Town Manager Ward said it's likely that division will have to be expanded.

movie entitled "Avalon," directed by Barry Levinson, came out in theaters in 1990. Avalon was a story of A Polish-Jewish family that comes to the U.S. at the beginning of the twentieth century.
